Because tours are scheduled on a first come, first served basis, requests with short notice will be difficult to accommodate, considering the high volume of requests. White House tours scheduled through the Congressional offices are available Tuesday through Saturday from 7:30 a.m. to 10 a.m. White House tours are subject to last-minute cancellation.
